Using repurposed office furnishings has the potential to influence up to 15 Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED®) certification points in three categories.

1 point	Credit 3.2	Material Reuse: 10%
1 point	Credit 4.1	Recycled Content, 10% (post-consumer + 1/2 pre-consumer)
1 point	Credit 4.2	Recycled Content, 20% (post-consumer + 1/2 pre-consumer)
1 point	Credit 5.1	Regional Materials, 10% Extracted, Processed and Manufactured Regionally
1 point	Credit 5.2	Regional Materials, 20% Extracted, Processed and Manufactured Regionally
